Two Honored with NYSTRS Excellence Awards
Capital District Residents Noted for Contributions to Retirement System

ALBANY, N.Y. (March 11, 2011) — Jacqueline Rymanowski and Ruth Cramer, both Capital District residents, were recently honored by the New York State Teachers' Retirement System with Excellence Awards.

Rymanowski, a resident of Melrose, was given the Significant Contribution of the Year Award for the instrumental role she played in the implementation of a new Employer Secure Area, a portal on the NYSTRS Web site allowing school districts and other employers to transact business over the Internet. Among her many contributions to the project were the acquisition of contact information, distribution of login data, and serving as a liaison between NYSTRS and its participating employers.

Cramer, a resident of East Greenbush, was given the Continual Contribution to Excellence Award for a career marked by her dedication to customer service and her positive influence on co-workers.
